



# **2025 BEAR JAW COMMUNITY CLEANUP**

**MONDAY, APRIL 28, 2025**

**Remove *Green Waste*, Reduce *Hazardous Fuels* & Meet Guidelines for a Firewise Community**

Protect your home from wildfire with help from the Highlands and Pinewood Fire District Fuels Reduction Program

**We are only accepting up to fifteen (15) clear bags of *green waste* (pine needles and leaves) per property.**

## **Green Waste Pickup Schedule**

**Have all items available along the roadside by 8:00 a.m. on Monday, April 28!**

**(If material is not curbside by this time, it may not be collected)**

- Collection will occur daily from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (excluding weekends) from April 28 until completed (est. Thursday, May 8).
- A limit of (15) Clear bags per household will be provided free of charge in early April 2025 and will be available at Highlands Fire Station # 23 & at the Pinewood Fire Station from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday – Friday.
- Additional items will not be collected after the crew has collected along your street.

## **RULES & GUIDELINES**

**Have all *GREEN WASTE* available along the roadside by the deadline.**

**Additional bags/slash will not be collected after the crew has worked down your street.**

- We will only collect **15 clear bags** per property.
- Only **15 clear bags** with pine needles and leaf litter will be collected.
- There will only be one collection each of green waste bags & slash per street.
- Refrain from combining piles between properties as it makes it difficult for our crew members to differentiate which property it came from. This will result in only 15 bags being collected.
- Collection of slash piles will begin once all bags are collected. Piles should be **no higher than 3 feet and fit within a 5-foot by 5-foot area, placed within five (5) feet of the road's edge.** Tree trunks and limbs up to **6" in diameter and up to 5' long will be accepted.** Larger items cannot be accepted.
- All stacked green waste (cut trimmings, etc.) must be stacked along the road with the cut ends towards the road to allow the crew to work safely. NO mechanical (tractor, bulldozer, etc.) stacked piles.

## PROHIBITED ITEMS

- NO Poison Oak, Ivy, cactus, weeds or plants with thorns will be accepted. Items that do not meet the criteria will be left on site.
- NO household trash, construction waste, lumber, wood with nails/screws, rocks or animal waste.

## FUEL REDUCTION TIPS

- Remove leaf/pine needle accumulation within at least 10 feet of your house.
- Cut down or thin trees to create defensible space on your property.
- Remove tall dry grass from the property surrounding your home.
- Remove leaves & pine needles from your gutters.
- Remove "Ladder Fuels"; prune tree limbs to 6 -10 feet above the ground.
- Prune excess growth from your bushes & shrubs regularly.

**KEEP DOING YOUR PART! If you fill more than 15 bags or are unable to source clear bags, then please note that the Willard Springs Green Waste Station is open for free green waste disposal. Click on the link below for time and dates of operation. The station no longer accepts bulk or household waste, so please only bring green waste materials. Willard Springs is located about 15 miles south of Flagstaff just west of Interstate 17 at Exit 326.
